A Message from your Shabbat Gabbi"

This week we continue our Triennial reading from the Book of Genesis, Parshah Vayetze, which means "And he left." Jacob leaves his hometown of Beersheba and travels to his Uncle Laban in Charan. In route he stops at the Temple Mount where God appears and assures him that he will return safely to the Land of Canaan. In Charan Jacob stays with and works for his uncle Laban who agrees to give him his younger daughter Rachel, whom Jacob loves, in marriage in return for seven years labor. But on the wedding night Laban gives him his elder daughter Leah instead, a deception Jacob discovers only in the morning. But a week later Jacob marries Rachel also after agreeing to work another seven years. Jacob stays for twenty years in Charan before returning to Canaan. He shepherds Laban's sheep and survives and prospers despite all his uncle's attempted deceptions. The first eleven children are born. For those with access to a copy of the Etz Hayim (or any other volume that contains the Five Books of Moses), the triennial reading can be found within Chapter 28, starting at Verse 10 on Page 166 of the Etz Hayim. The weekly reading concludes on page 176 in Chapter 30, at the end of verse 13.
